Race News

August 7 – Long Course



Just twenty-one racers showed up for the fifth race of the season. 600SS racer Vern Heath (#41) stopped by to say hi, a spectator after breaking his left scapula during the July 31st track day. Kim Nakashima (#1) vowed to win or crash in defense of the #1 plate. Noah Gietka (#20) performed a close up inspection of the tarmac just past the gate shack during practice which resulted in his being unable to participate for the remainder of the day.

Open GP: Garry Combs (#3) and Layden Paulino (#2) each won a race, with Garry finishing on top due to his second place in race 2. Alas, Kim proved prophetic as he low-sided in the off camber during race two, dropping him to third for the day.

Open Superstreet: This class continues to be the most popular this season, with six entrants. (Thirteen racers have competed in OpenSS this year.) Quinn Swift (#12) swept both races, even though his R1 was missing most of its tail. Could it have been the turbulence coming off his suit that ate away the bodywork? Bruce and Tyrone rounded up the top 3.

750 Superstreet: Aaron Abaya (#6) and Tyrone Montayre (#4) each took one race, with Guy Caruso (#37) finishing in third for the day.

600 Superstreet: Saw the return of Jupiter Kajiwara (#31) and he and Tyrone Montayre (#4) won a race with Sean Mason (#32) and Miles Miller (#35) coming in third. Tyrone continues his stranglehold on the “Iron Man” award, as he is now running in four classes.

600 Production: Bruce Ramsey (#24) and Aaron Abaya (#6) continued their battle with Bruce coming out on top in each race.



Formula II/III: Robert Bessara (#7) and Tom Cesar (#22) continued to duke it out for the bragging rights in the junior GP classes. With Joey Riveira (#9) absent for the second straight race, the season standings have gone through a major reshuffle.

Season Recap

With just three races to go in the 2005 season, Layden Paulino (#2) extended his lead over Kim Nakashima in Formula I to 21 points. Quinn Swift (#12) continues to sit atop Open Superstreet, leading by 66 points over Tyrone. In 750 Superstreet, Tyrone Montayre (#4) leads Aaron Abaya (#6) by 23 points and holds a 31 point lead over Miles Miller (#35) in 600 Superstreet. Robert Bessara (#7) took over the lead in Formula II from Joey Riveira (#9) who has missed the last two races. Tom Cesar (#22) now holds a slim 4 point lead over Robert Bessara in Formula III. Bruce Ramsey (#24) has a huge 70 point lead in 600 Production.

Other News
