## Race News

### November 6 – Long Course

Twenty-four racers participated in the final race of the 2005 season.

**Open GP:** Layden Paulino (#2) finished second in race one and won race two to take the Formula I title and the coveted #1 plate for 2006. Garry Combs (#3) won race one and came in third in race two. Kim Nakashima (#1) had to settle for third in race one and second in race two.



**Open Superstreet:** In “the class” of 2005, nine racers took to the starting grid. Tyrone Montayre (#4) won both races, with Aaron Abaya (#6) and Bruce Ramsey (#24) finishing second and third.

**750 Superstreet:** Tyrone Montayre (#4) led the way by winning both races, with Aaron Abaya (#6) finishing second and Guy Caruso (#37) third in each heat.

**600 Superstreet:** Jupiter Kajiwara (#31) won both races. Stan Riner (#0) was 2<sup>nd</sup> in race one, with Aaron Abaya (#6) third. In race two, Aaron finished second and Sean Mason (#32) took third.



**600 Production:** Aaron Abaya (#6) won both races but Bruce Ramsey (#24) garnered enough points to take the class title. Jon Waters (#45) returned on his resurrected CBR600RR to take third.

**Formula II:** Robert Bessara (#7) took both races to win the class going away. Tom Cesar (#22) provided the sole competition to Robert.

**Formula III:** Déjà vu, Robert Bessara (#7) won both races to wrap up the Formula III title over Tom Cesar (#22).

## Season Recap

The king is dead, long live the king! Layden Paulino (#2) wrapped up the Formula I (Open GP) title, beating seven time consecutive #1 plate holder Kim Nakashima by 36 points. Garry Combs (#3) finished in third place, unable to overcome his non-points finish in the January race.

Tyrone “Iron Man” Montayre (#4) wrapped up the 750 Superstreet title in style by winning the November race. Aaron Abaya (#6) finished 33 points in arrears with Guy Caruso (#37) a distant third.

Robert Bessara (#7) locked up the Formula III title over Tom Cesar (#22) by 24 points. Previous title holder Joey Riveira (#9) finished third due to missing four races.

The other classes were settled in October: Quinn Swift (#12) took Open Superstreet; Robert Bessara (#7) took Formula II; Tyrone Montayre (#4) added 600 Superstreet to his cache of titles and Bruce Ramsey (#24) took the 600 Production class.
