Race News

October 9 – Fast Course

Twenty-one racers took to the track for the penultimate race of the season, fast course, the configuration which generates the lowest lap times.

With the season coming to a close, the action was hot and heavy as none of the class wins had been locked up.

Open GP: Kim Nakashima (#1) almost pulled off the double win he needs to close

in on the #1 plate but Layden Paulino (#2) made a pass on the last lap of heat 2 to take the win. Garry Combs (#3) finished second in heat 1 and third in heat 2.



Open Superstreet:

Quinn Swift (#12) swept both heats and locked up the class title for 2005. Aaron Abaya (#6) fought off Bruce Ramsey (#24) to finish second and third, respectively.

750 Superstreet:

Hurrah, the class is not dead! Five racers took to the track, including the

return of Guy Caruso (#37), Pat Gill (#11) and Michael Ransom (#34). Iron man Tyrone Montayre (#4) led the way, with Aaron Abaya (#6) finishing second and Guy third in each heat.

600 Superstreet: Tyrone Montayre (#4) won both heats and takes the class title for 2005. Bruce Ramsey (#24) putting in a last second bid for the “Iron Butt” award by running in 4 classes, took second in each heat with Jupiter Kajiwara (#31) finishing third.

600 Production: Aaron Abaya (#6) won both heats but couldn't prevent Bruce Ramsey (#24) from compiling enough points to take the class title for 2005. Bruce finished second in each heat and Raymond Sipin (#86) returned to take third.

Formula II: Jon Waters (#45) took to the field on a borrowed RS125 to give Robert Bessara (#7) and Tom Cesar (#22) some competition. Unfortunately, he ran afoul of the compact riding position and wasn't able to finish each heat. Robert won both heats and locked up the class title. Tom, riding his new 2005 RS125 for the first time, is getting ever closer to finishing in front of Robert.

Formula III: Robert Bessara (#7) won both heats to increase his points lead over Tom Cesar (#22), who finished second. Jon Waters (#45) came in third.

Novice: Just three riders took to the track. Darret Nishikawa (#28) took Big Bike in a non-points finish due to this being his 6th novice race. Sean Canfield (#95) and Frog Davis (#21) split heat wins in Small Bike.

Season Recap

With just one race to go, Layden Paulino (#2) has a 27 point lead over Kim Nakashima for the #1 plate in Formula I. Quinn Swift (#12) has locked up Open Superstreet, leading by 109 points over Bruce Ramsey. In 750 Superstreet, Tyrone Montayre (#4) leads Aaron Abaya (#6) by 23 points and has locked up the class win in 600 Superstreet, leading Miles Miller by 104 points. Robert Bessara (#7) wins Formula II as he holds a 71 point lead over Joey Riveira (#9). Robert has a 14 point lead over Tom Cesar (#22) in Formula III. Bruce Ramsey (#24) locked up the 600 Production class title as he leads Aaron Abaya (#6) by 70 points.

So, the November 6th race will decide who wins Formula I and the coveted #1 plate, 750SS, and Formula III.
